The Art of Photography

Walker Evans, the great American photographer, made a famously cryptic statement: "Looking is harder than it looks".

The photographic work in this exhibition hosted by the Emporium Center exemplifies the spirit of Evans' claim. Among the arts, photography is the most egalitarian. All of us can see, but some — the artists in this exhibition — see better. All of us acknowledge the objects before us, but these artists discover or imbue meaning. In the end, what it is about is more important than how it looks.

The photographs in this exhibition undeniably possess the power to move the viewer. This condition exists not only because of what each photographer sees, but rather because of what he/she intended. The content of the photograph is not only what was there but also what was supplied by the photographer.

The pieces in this show are works of art. A successful work of art is characterized by the following:

- · Content—it is about something of importance
- · Form—it demonstrates mastery over its medium
- · Point of View-it contains elements of autobiography
